foreign residence was Kamionka; I am unmarried; the name of my wife is Catherine; she was born in Aust. Hung. and now resides with me.

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Charles Emperor of Austria and Apostolic King of Hungary or the present government of Austria Hungary as the case may be, of which I am now a subject.

I arrived at the port of Baltimore in the State of Maryland on or about the 7th day of May, anno Domini 1907.

I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:
